

new qualification options

for those working as a personal assistant -
level 3 diploma in health and social care
(adults) for england (QCF)

The purpose of this document is to provide case study scenarios to demonstrate how learners may tailor their learning to their job role on the new qualifications and credit framework (QCF). We aim to support learners to make informed choices about the options available to them on the framework. The units on the reverse are only examples of possible combinations that could be taken and are not intended to form guidance. Together these units form the Level 3 Diploma in Health and Social Care.

setting:

Personal assistant working with one or more direct payment recipients

role:

- Supporting and enabling people to live independently
- Support with daily living skills including personal care
- Providing support, advice and guidance



structure of qualification:

The level 3 diploma in health and social care (adults) for England (QCF) is made up of 58 credits or more from three different groups.

- Group A is made up of 9 mandatory units = 28 credits
- Group B is made up of knowledge only units that offers the opportunity to undertake either a generic or specialist learning disabilities or dementia pathway. There is a choice of units within the rules of combination and these are stipulated in order to achieve the appropriate pathway.
- Group C provides the opportunity to take a variety of competence units that reflect job roles. This includes a range of both specialist and generic units.

Combined credits from group B and C = at least 30 credits
